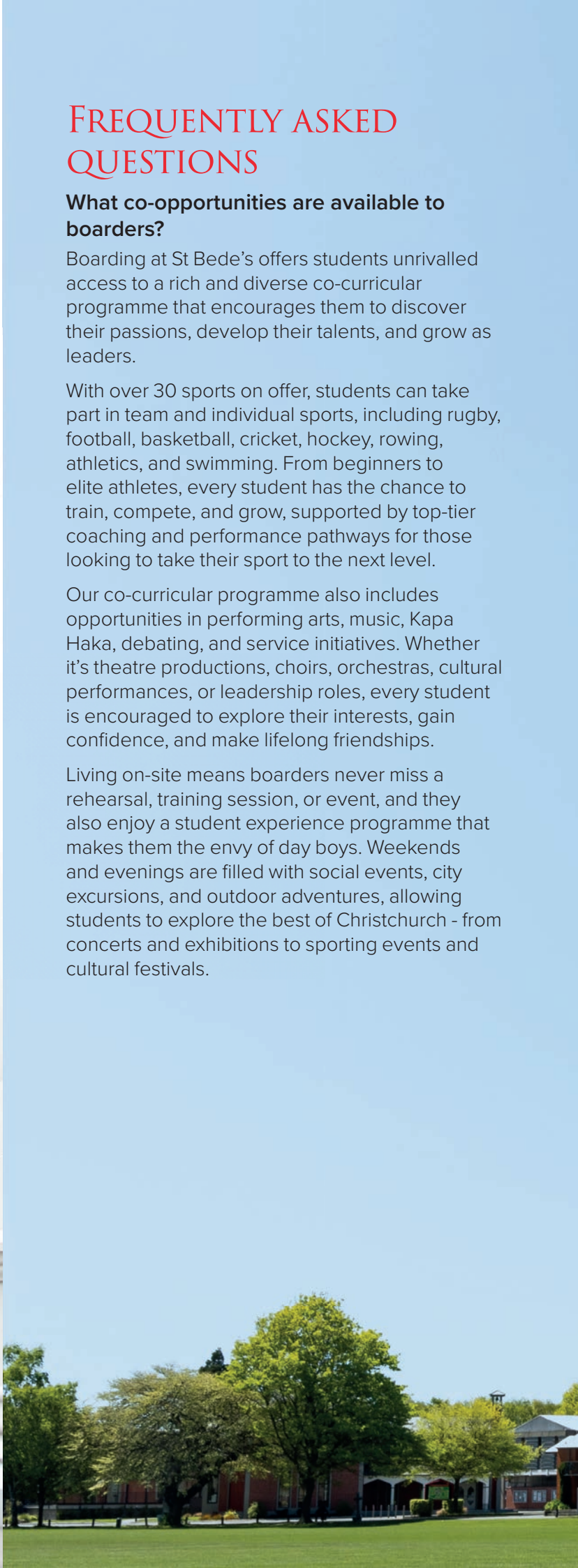
What co-opportunities are available to boarders?

Boarding at St Bede's offers students unrivalled access to a rich and diverse co-curricular programme that encourages them to discover their passions, develop their talents, and grow as leaders.

With over 30 sports on offer, students can take part in team and individual sports, including rugby, football, basketball, cricket, hockey, rowing, athletics, and swimming. From beginners to elite athletes, every student has the chance to train, compete, and grow, supported by top-tier coaching and performance pathways for those looking to take their sport to the next level.

Our co-curricular programme also includes opportunities in performing arts, music, Kapa Haka, debating, and service initiatives. Whether it's theatre productions, choirs, orchestras, cultural performances, or leadership roles, every student is encouraged to explore their interests, gain confidence, and make lifelong friendships.

Living on-site means boarders never miss a rehearsal, training session, or event, and they also enjoy a student experience programme that makes them the envy of day boys. Wellbeing is prioritised through the Centre of Wellbeing, where boarders have access to expert care, mental health resources, and personal development support. Spiritual growth is nurtured through the Centre of Faith and Leadership, offering opportunities for reflection, service, and leadership.

Is boarding expensive?

Boarding at St Bede's is affordable relative to comparable schools, offering unparalleled value for money while providing a world-class education and boarding experience. Our fees cover accommodation, meals, education, pastoral care, some co-curricular opportunities, and access to state-of-the-art facilities, ensuring that every student has the support and resources to thrive.

Does my son have to be a baptised Catholic to attend?

No, your son does not need to be a baptised Catholic to board at St Bede's. We walk alongside each young man on his faith journey, supporting him to grow in character, purpose, and service to others. While we are proudly a Catholic school, we welcome students from all backgrounds who are open to embracing our values and traditions.

As an integrated school, St Bede's operates under an enrolment scheme that gives priority to students who meet one of the five preference criteria. However, limited places are available for non-preference students, and we encourage families to contact us to discuss eligibility and the application process.

For those interested, we offer a Sacramental Programme, allowing students to explore and deepen their faith through baptism and other sacraments.
